**DETAILS OF INJURY/ILLNESS/IMPACT/DAMAGE (include photographs)**

The driver suffered bruising to the back of the head.

The vehicle and fence were damaged per photo 2.

An inspection of the site indicated gravel aggregate build up which may have contributed to the loss of control.

The vehicle was a 2WD tray backed ute. Being light in the tail the vehicle would be prone to skipping when the road is rough and loss traction where there is excess gravel or sand.

<b>Shared Learning's</b>	<p>Advice for when driving on gravel roads:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Drive within your own abilities. If you are not experienced at driving on gravel roads take your time and don't rush. Keep your speed below 80km/h.</li> </ul>

	<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• If the vehicle has a 4WD function then use it. This helps the vehicle stay aligned and less prone to skip or slide out.</li><li>• Be aware that rural roads may not have advisory speed signs for corners.</li><li>• Drive to the conditions. If you feel the vehicle skipping or sliding, slow down.</li></ul>
