

High Risk Work Policy

High Risk work refers to work that requires a person to have a licence to perform that work, this includes but isn't limited to;

- basic, intermediate and advanced scaffolding
- working at heights
- dogging
- basic, intermediate and advanced rigging
- crane and hoist operation
- reach stacker operation
- forklift operation
- pressure equipment operation
- electrical works
- boom-type elevating platform operation.

Pure Rail deems these tasks as high risk work and under no circumstances are any Pure Rail staff to undertake the above-mentioned works without consent from a Pure Rail Director (in permanent form). Pure Rail Directors will only authorise these activities to suitably qualified and competent individuals.

Any Pure Rail equipment will have a relevant instruction manual for the safe operation of the equipment supplied by Pure Rail. Third party machinery will require the operator to obtain a safe operation manual prior to undertaking any task. Employees are to ensure they are confident they are able to safely undertake the proscribed activity prior to accepting any assignment.

Pure Rail will record any permissions issued to staff in permanent form.
