Inland Rail: N2NS SP1 - Trailer Detachment

Type: Serious event

LOCATION

Inland Rail Narrabri to North Star - SP1 (N2NS - SP1), Edgeroi NSW

BRIEF DESCRIPTION

On Sunday 25th September at approximately 11:00am, a haulage subcontractor was operating a triple side tipper road train combination to deliver ballast to site.

The road train entered site under traffic control stop light, the driver then turned immediately left to gain access to the main alignment.

As the driver entered the alignment, the rear trailer of the triple combination detached from the middle rear trailer in

It came to rest on its connection housing, adjacent to the main alignment

No workers or plant were in the immediate vicinity, no injuries were sustained from this event.

Immediate Actions:

- The T4MR Supervisor attended the scene, secured the area and informed T4MR Safety and Earthworks / Pavement Superintendent.
- Drug and alcohol testing was conducted on the driver with both results negative.
- All trucks on site to have a thorough inspection of all trailer combinations prior to site departure, this was conveyed through the T4MR supervisor to the drivers.
- The trailer was recovered and moved to a safe location so a qualified plant fitter could inspect the trailer king pin and the turntable on the middle trailer.
- Investigation commenced.

Immediate Learnings:

- King pin was assessed as being in poor condition with significant wear.
- A replacement king pin was fitted to the rear trailer and after the inspection the fitter deemed the trailer fit for safe operation.
